The Medical Mission work of the Diocese of Charleston seeks two nurses (RN or LPN) to work with a physician providing for the healthcare needs of the poor in San Pedro La Laguna, Guatemala. Two nurses would volunteer for a three-month stay at the San Pedro parish while living and taking meals at the Sisters of Bethania convent.
