We are waiting for the portables to be made available by the school district. The units are currently being used for storage but should be available later this year. After consulting with numerous governmental agencies and procuring a number of bids, the Building Committee of the St. Joseph School Advisory Board has put together a plan to prepare the site and place the units. Although a small area of the land will need to be cleared, every effort will be made to keep the number of trees disturbed to a minimum and to beautify the area with fresh paint and landscaping.
