**UPDATE: MASS ATTENDANCE AND GROUP MEETINGS.**

Effective June 15, 2020, Bishop Guglielmono has given parishes permission to increase our allowable capacity to 50 % for Masses. 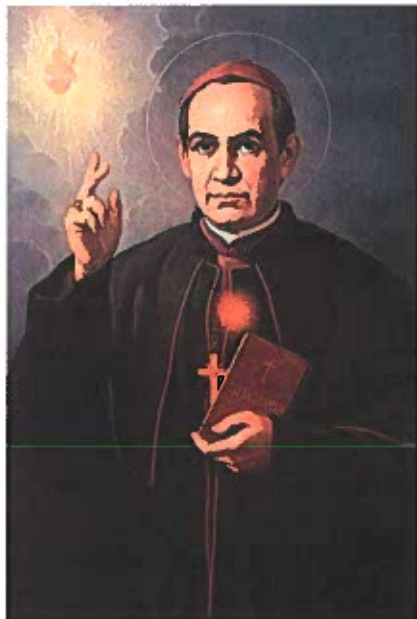

## Pastor's Corner

**Anthony Mary Claret** (Catalan: Antoni Maria Claret i Clarà; Spanish: Antonio María Claret y Clarà; December 23, 1807 – October 24, 1870) was a Spanish Roman Catholic archbishop and missionary, and was confessor of Isabella II of Spain.

Continuing our discussion on St. Anthony Mary Claret from last weekend:



### LOVE OF CHRIST DRIVES US

St. Anthony Mary Claret here writes about evangelization and the fire of apostolic zeal characteristic of the missionary spirit. He himself exemplified this in his own life, having founded a society of missionaries and serving as a zealous missionary bishop, aflame with divine love.

Driven by the fire of the Holy Spirit, the holy apostles traveled throughout the earth. Inflamed with the same fire, apostolic missionaries have reached, are now reaching, and will continue to reach the ends of the earth, from one pole to the other, in order to proclaim the word of God. They are deservedly able to apply to themselves those words of the apostle Paul: The love of Christ drives us on. The love of Christ arouses us, urges us to run, and to fly, lifted on the wings of holy zeal.

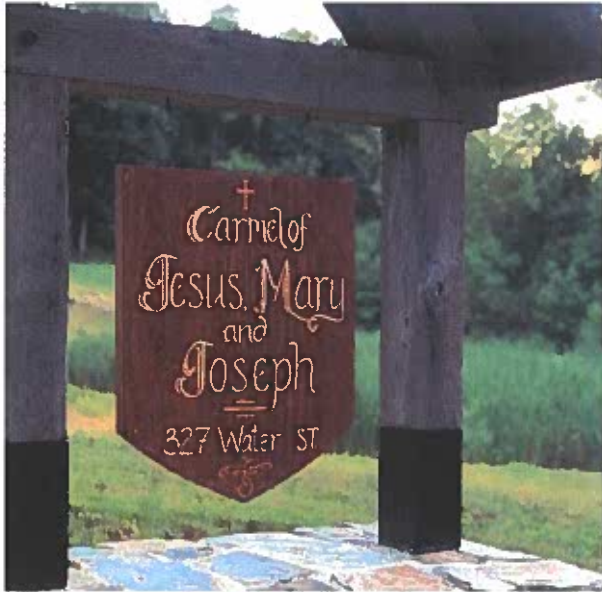
The man who truly loves God loves his neighbor. The truly zealous man is also one who loves, but he stands on a higher plane of love, the more urgently zeal drives him on. But if anyone lacks this zeal, then it is evident that love and charity have been extinguished from his heart. The zealous man desires and achieves all great things and he labors strenuously so that God may always be better known, loved and served in this world and in the life to come, for this holy love is without end.

Because he is concerned also for his neighbor, the man of zeal works to fulfill his desire that all men be content on this earth and happy and blessed in their heavenly homeland, that all may be saved, and that no one may perish forever, or offend God, or remain even for a moment in sin. Such are the concerns we observe in the holy apostles and in all who are driven by the apostolic spirit.

For myself, I say this to you: The man who burns with the fire of divine love is a son of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and wherever he goes, he enkindles that flame; he desires and works with all his strength to enflame all men with the fire of God's love. Nothing deters him: he rejoices in poverty; he labors strenuously; he welcomes hardships; he laughs off false accusations; he rejoices in anguish. He thinks only of how he might follow Jesus Christ and imitate him by his prayers, his labors, his sufferings, and by caring always and only for the glory of God and the salvation of souls.

#### THE MISSION & LIFE:

The **Carmel of Jesus, Mary and Joseph** is a papally-enclosed Discalced Carmelite community in the rural farmlands of Pennsylvania. Tracing their roots back to sixteenth century Spain and seventeenth century Mexico, they are one of six other traditional foundations from the Carmel in Valparaiso, Nebraska.

The Carmelite charism of prayer is the backbone of this monastery. The Divine Office, the Holy Mass, two hours of silent prayer, and the Holy Rosary are the most tangible signs of this life, but their work and their silence are also in and of themselves prayer and contemplation. Living a life of solitude, prayer, and sacrifice, the nuns' primary mission is to pray for the Church and its priests.

They are the **Heart of the Church** — beating with continuous prayer and sacrifice, bringing the vital flow of grace to the other members of the Mystical Body of Christ.

- FULLY** In communion with the Roman Catholic Church and at the invitation of the bishop, the Most Reverend Ronald Gainer, withIn the Harrisburg, PA diocese
- PRIMARILY** Use the Extraordinary Form of the Holy Mass and the Divine Office and wear the full, traditional Carmelite habit
- OBSERVE** The Rule and the Constitution just as they were written in the 1200's and 1500's, respectively, and use the original Carmelite breviaries of St. John of the Cross and St. Teresa of Avila
- PROMOTE** Age-old Christian values and culture by living a contemplative monastic life
- UNDERTAKE** To lead an austere and laborious life, which reduces their needs to the essentials
- TRUST** In Divine Providence for their sustenance, relying entirely on alms and in-kind donations (no funding from the diocese is received)
- CHOOSE** To live a simple, retired lifestyle largely free of modern conveniences, comforts, and technology
- CARRY** Out their monastic life in the context of a farmstead milieu



**A DAY IN CARMEL:**

**4:00 a.m.** The day starts with the sound of the traditional “clapper”: a call to praise God dating from the time of St. Teresa herself.

**4:30 a.m.** Silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament.

**5:30 a.m.** The Minor Hours of the Divine Office which are in Latin. The Nuns use the ancient Carmelite Rite, which St. Teresa also prayed.



**7:00 a.m.** The Nuns don their white mantles to prepare for the Most Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

**8:00 a.m.** Each Sister works in solitude, in a spirit of prayer and recollection. Work is done under obedience with a willing and joyful heart.

**10:40 a.m.** The large bell rings calling the Sisters to choir for a visit to the Blessed Sacrament to pray the Litany of Our Lady and for an examination of conscience.

**11:00 a.m.** The monastic meals take place in silence while a Sister reads from Holy Scripture or other spiritual books.

**12:00 p.m.** At this hour the Nuns gather together in the recreation room as a family. As they work in common, it is a time of much joy and laughter.

**1:00 p.m.** Retirement in the cell.

**2:30 p.m.** The Nuns gather again in the Choir to pray Vespers and for Spiritual Reading.

**3:30 p.m.** Time for work, sewing, farm work, and cooking, wherever God calls. Novices gather for spiritual instruction given by the Novice Mistress.

**5:00 p.m.** Quiet prayer.

**6:00 p.m.** A light evening meal, followed by another hour of Recreation.

**7:30 p.m.** Compline is prayed followed by the Rosary. Grand Silence then begins, lasting until Prime the following day. Matins and Lauds begin at 9:00pm.

**10:00 p.m.** The Carmelite retires, grateful for all the graces received throughout the day.
